A story of change



After a year of homeschooling, Rohan joined a school. He started showing signs of aggression, rudeness, and social withdrawal when he entered his teenage years. He would get angry over the slightest things, his behavior drastically impacted by teenage hormones.

Then Veena Di began providing Rohan with special mentoring and guidance, and it became clear that he had traumatic memories of witnessing his father's violence against his mother.

Through three years of dedicated support, life skills workshops, and heartfelt conversations, we slowly helped him confront his issues. Frisbee training became a vital outlet, channeling his anger into positive energy. This sport has given him the focus and drive to follow his dream of becoming a sports coach.

Gradually, Rohan transformed. He became disciplined, calm, and understanding.



He now leads his team and excels in his studies. Rohan dreams of becoming a Frisbee coach, and we are all cheering for his dreams to come true.

As highlighted in our previous newsletter, we launched our first three-month Paid Mentorship Program Started in March end, for our young adults and youth. The program focused not only on skills learning but also understanding of essential job skills like etiquette, discipline, self-development, hard work, time management, and commitment, all of which will benefit their future careers.

Surprisingly, most of the children showed interest in joining Kathak class, in fact, the boys were more enthusiastic about learning Kathak than the girls.

Throughout the month, they learned the basic names of hand postures, movement names, how to do Namaskar, footwork, and chakkars. Now, we want to continue this program for a year with Shubham so the children can learn with more focus and dedication.

Workshop for special abled youth And we didn't forget our differently-abled youth and very young children; **Shabila** took charge of engaging them in various art workshops like clay modeling, leaf painting, storytelling through newspapers, and painting. It was a beautiful workshop that enhanced the children's creativity.



Menstruation awareness

As we know, menstruation awareness is essential for every girl. Recognizing the need for our growing girls to be informed about this, Bhaswati Di conducted a workshop on this topic.

She explained the menstrual cycle by drawing of the body, changes that happen in the body, and the importance of hygiene during this time. The girls had many questions, which Bhaswati Di addressed. Fifteen of our girls benefited from this workshop.

Good - Bad Touch and Early Age Menstruation**

Teaching younger children about good and bad touch is an essential part of our program, and we do it regularly. Summer vacation is a good time for this due to the holidays, so Veena Di took this opportunity to conduct a workshop on this topic.

Through animation videos and roleplay, she made the children aware of different types of touch. The children raised many questions about the difference between good and bad touch.

Additionally, she addressed the issue of early menstruation in girls and how to deal with it, speaking to all the children above 10 years old. Twenty children participated in this workshop.



Water Crisis Awareness

The water crisis is a major problem in India due to rising temperatures, and it's expected to worsen in the coming years. Veena Di took the initiative to make children aware of this crisis and teach them how to save water and recharge rainwater to increase groundwater levels. She showed a few movies on heat waves and the water crisis in India. After watching the movies, a deep discussion took place among the children about heat waves and water conservation. They all decided to create a rainwater recharge system on the Karm Marg campus.

Impact: This kind of workshop expands children's knowledge and makes them aware of the seriousness of the situation.





Caregivers support workshop

As an organization, we understand the challenges of working with children and youth and recognize the importance of staff mental health. Therefore, we decided to provide training on coping with stress, managing anger, and promoting good mental health for our caregiver team.

Thanks to Kolkata Sanved conducted this workshop for our care workers, hosted by Shubham Srivastava. Eight of our care workers participated in the workshop.
